Business Manager's Report

Part of our trouble is that residency is a little low. This problem limits our standard cash flow, and as such we have been running a very tight budget. The logical solution to this problem is to find more people. Boarders make up some of the difference, but we currently have unoccupied rooms. Filling the house is also very important considering the number of actives that will be graduating this year. I therefore urge all alumni to tell any gentlemen that may be coming to the University of Michigan about Phi Alpha Kappa. Our current membership is stable, but everyone in the active chapter dreams of having a full house with no non-member boarders.

High expenses have also caused some financial woes. I know I have said it before, but the house is old and she needs some work. The city inspection at the end of last summer cited many areas in need of repair, most were minor, but the costs did add up. Over the summer a few actives also remodeled the main floor bathroom, the results look great, but as expected they weren't cheap. We also were forced to buy a new freezer for the beginning of the school year after it was decided that one of the old ones could be repaired no more. I do think our recent expenditures

have greatly benefited the house, but we do need to be prepared for future expenses.

Just as we have spent money the Alumni Board and Preservation Foundation are also involved in a major project. The city of Ann Arbor in their inspection said that the fascia on the back of the house needed to be repaired, this project will likely use most of their available funds. I therefore urge you to donate to the foundation, it is a great way to help both the house and Phi Alpha Kappa last forever.
