### **The Dutch House Preservation thanks you for your support**

A special thanks to the alumni and friends who have contributed generously to the Dutch House Preservation Foundation. The Dutch House Preservation Foundation is a nonprofit organization (donations are tax exempt) that has been created to preserve the physical structure and building of Phi Alpha Kappa. The Dutch House Preservation Foundation is partially responsible, along with the Alumni Board, for funding major projects like the reconstruction of the third floor dormer and the repair of the roof. ## Sergeant-at-Arm's Report

Things are looking good at the Dutch House thanks to the Alumni Board for redoing the trim, door jambs, and carpet in the hallways. The members have done a lot of work in cleaning and fixing up the house up. I recommend you come and take a look for yourself.

First and foremost, new oak trim was put in all the halls and down the stairways. The trim is stained to match the trim around the rest of the house. It has been varnished to provide durability. All the doors have been sanded down, stained, and varnished to emulate their original wood finish.

Second, the hallways have been repainted. Members worked long and hard to patch the walls and then repaint the entire second and third floor halls. The walls were repainted off-white to accent the trim better than the yellow did.

Third, the carpet in all the halls is presently being redone. The color is going to be a sapphire blue which isn't much different from the present carpet except for being much cleaner and hopefully longer lasting. The deep blue really helps bring out the beauty of the trim and brings the whole project together.

Workday was very successful as well. We were able to repair the porch, finish painting the hallways, fix the internet, and repair phone lines among other things.

Even with all that has been done there are still several improvements needed. The highest priority is a new water main for the house. Over the summer the water main cracked because it was so rusted. It was repaired temporarily but it could break again at any time, and the plumber recommended it get fixed before winter comes. Also, many of the house pictures need to be re-framed and re-hung.

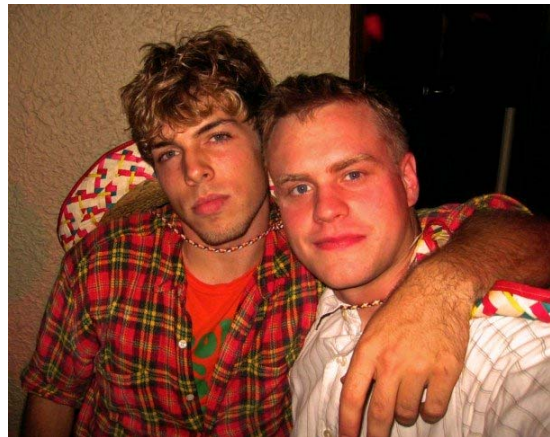
**Jim Hughes** By Anthony Abruzzo



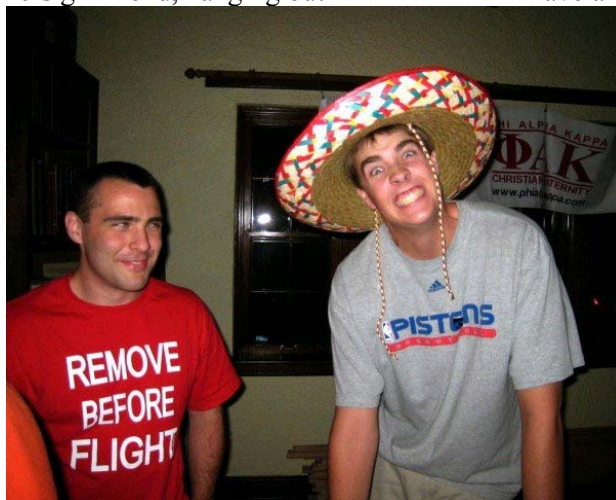

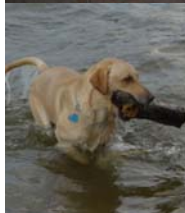

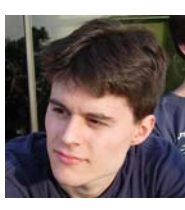
